Note on big wins: Based on our assessment of current and planned initiatives, we will begin to identify a handful of initiatives and outcomes for each strategy that would significantly contribute to reducing emissions or sequestering carbon in our lands. For this meeting, we won't be too worried about feasibility (though we should stay within some bounds of reality). Nor will we identify specific actions or policies that would be needed to implement the big win. We will address those in future meetings.

For this meeting, please come with some ideas about potential big wins. We will be brainstorming, so everything is good at this stage.

As an example, here are three samples of a big win for each strategy:

Strategy 1: Initiate tree planting on all wildfire burn scars in the County (including USFS lands) where natural regeneration is lagging

Strategy 2: Develop and implement a plan to protect private lands in the County with the largest benefit for carbon sequestration using PDR program.

Strategy 3: Prohibit installation of irrigated “non-functional” turf in all new developments

Strategy 4: Insure no new subdivision of properties outside of designated growth areas
